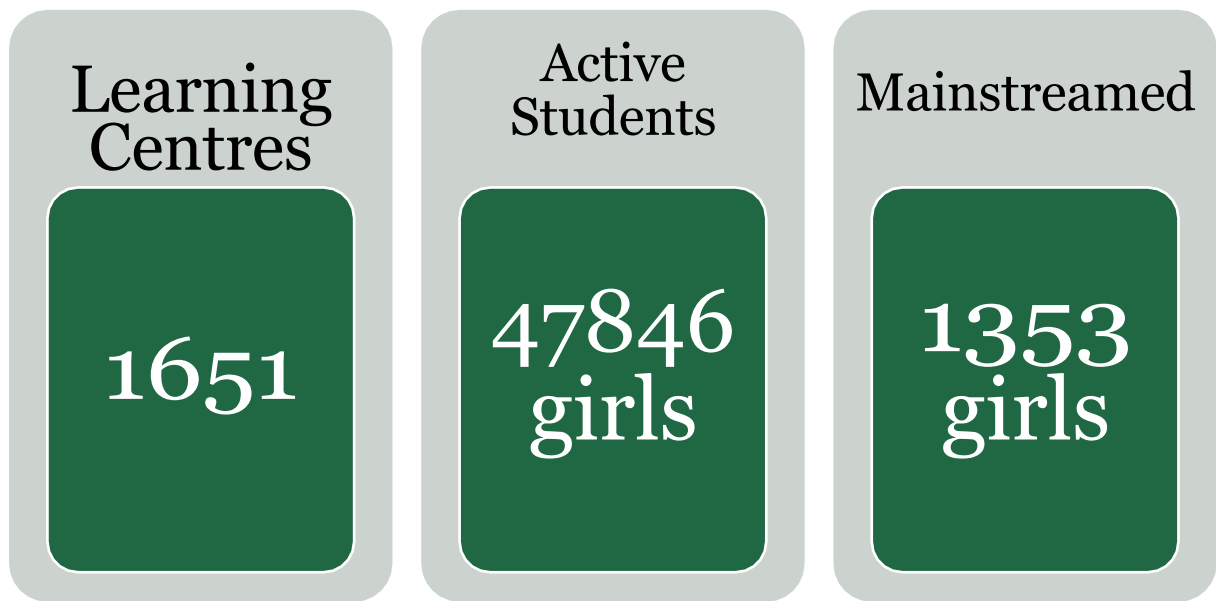

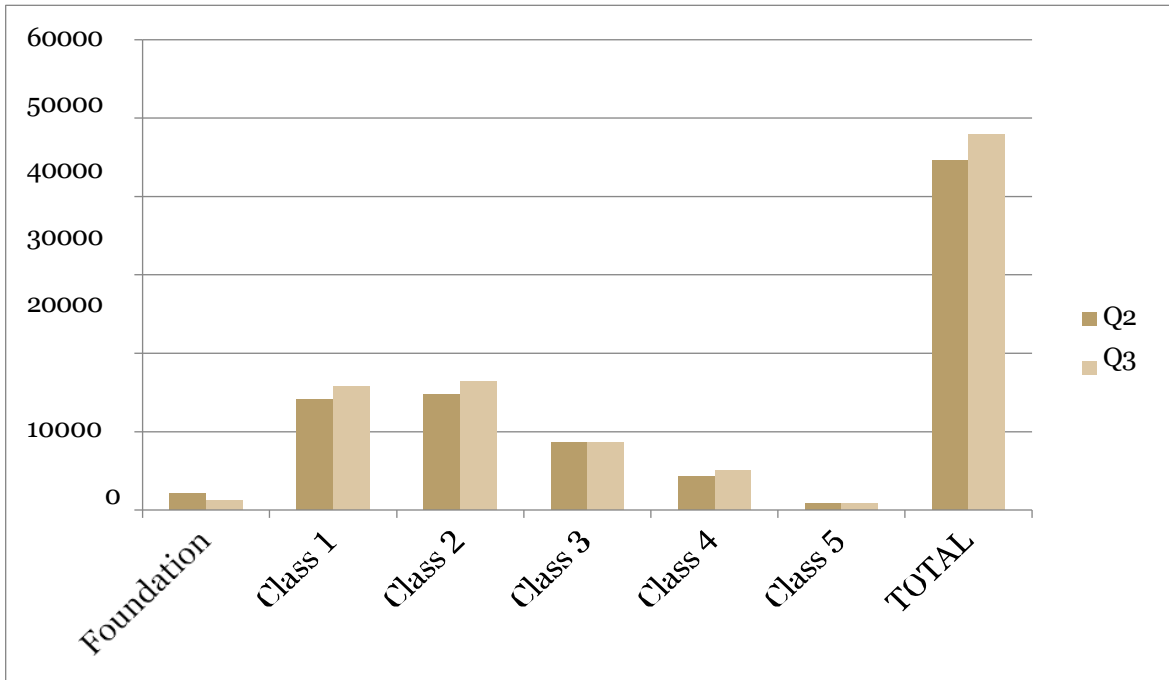
**Overall Update of Girl Child Education Programme (GCEP)**

## HIGHLIGHTS OF Q3

- All the Quarterly Teacher Trainings (QTT) were completed by the first month of the quarter, The reason for conducting all the QTTs in the first month of the quarter was to maximise benefits from the training and, so that teachers have enough time to implement what they have learnt at the Learning Centre and get necessary feedback and support from the training team.



- Based on previous quarter's QTA & QGA focused attention was given on weak teachers. Virtual session was conducted for the teachers where they discussed the challenges they are facing related to students' progress and learning. Possible solutions for improving the learning were also discussed.
- One of the major activities this quarter was the implementation of the Mothers Literacy Programme. Members of the partner organization of Titan and MG Motor supported centres along with IIMPACT staff have received both online and physical training regarding this. IIMPACT partnered with Devi Sansthan in this regard who conducted the training.



- In Bundi, Rajasthan our students participated in the District Level Kishori Mela out of whom 10 girls secured first position.



- A farewell was organized for all the 7 students from LC Mohana in Khargone who were mainstreamed this quarter.

- Yashashwi Sayed from Khargone M.P. and Navrin Parvin from Pakur Jharkhand were enrolled in Navodaya Vidyalaya this quarter.
- Around 4 girls from our LCs in Alwar got selected in Navodaya in much higher grades like 8, 9 and 10.
- In Karauli 6 girls got selected and enrolled in Kasturba Gandhi Vidyalaya.

## STORIES THAT INSPIRE

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### Ghazala Yasmeen Begum's inspirational journey

Ghazala Yasmeen Begum, a resident of Gothra, has overcome formidable odds to emerge as a beacon of inspiration in her community.

With only a disabled brother and father to care for them, the family struggled to make ends meet. Furthermore, Ghazala's educational aspirations were thwarted by the reluctance of his father and younger sister to invest in education.

Undeterred by obstacles, Ghazala pursued her higher board education under difficult circumstances. Her academic journey took a turning point when she applied for a teaching position in IIMPACT's Girls Education Program at Gothra Center (Centre Code: 01364). Initially her motivation was to support her family financially, but when she took up teaching in Ghazal felt a deep sense of connection with his community discovered.



"In very difficult circumstances, I completed my higher board and was interviewed for a teaching position with the IIMPACT organization's girls' education program. The initial goal was to support my family, but when I started teaching those girls, I realized that teaching is a profession where I can make a significant contribution to the community and society. It suits me well, given the background I come from, and I can relate to everyone present there."

While teaching at an IIMPACT-supported learning centre, she completed her graduation and obtained her D.led (Diploma in Elementary Education). Afterward, she successfully passed the C.T.E.T and a Bihar Government Examination, leading to her selection as a teacher in a government school.

Ghazala attributes her success to the transformative impact of IIMPACT's Girl Child Education Program. Ghazala Yasmin Begum's tale is a testament to the transformative power of schooling and determination.

## Kavita a poet in the making!

Kavita belongs to a poor family where her mother is a housewife, and her father is the sole breadwinner who works as a labourer. Being part of a family with a challenging environment and poor economic conditions, education was never considered important, let alone a priority. Despite Kavita showing signs of being an intelligent learner, she was not encouraged to study.



The teacher of the Learning Centre says that Kavita has been a curious learner and quite dedicated from the very beginning. She is quick at understanding concepts and calculations. Although there is no doubt that Kavita is a talented girl, ever since she started coming to IIMPACT's Learning Centre, there has been an unimaginable change in her personality.

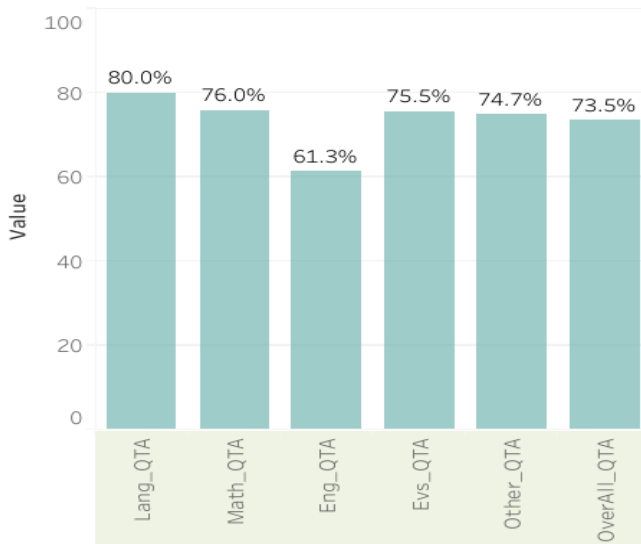
IIMPACT has played a very important role in enhancing her qualities. Activity-based learning, Multi-Grade multi-level teaching methodology, peer learning and support, and the use of extensive teaching-learning materials in class at the IIMPACT centres have made Kavita extremely interested in studies.

Regular meetings of the teacher with her parents and home visits have helped her parents become more aware and supportive towards Kavita's education. They now encourage her to come to the centre and also go to school. Kavita loves poetry, something she discovered when she joined the centre, she loves to learn. Now she wants to study further, write her own poems and contribute to her society, a dream which was probably unthinkable for before.

### Quarterly Teacher Assessment (QTA)

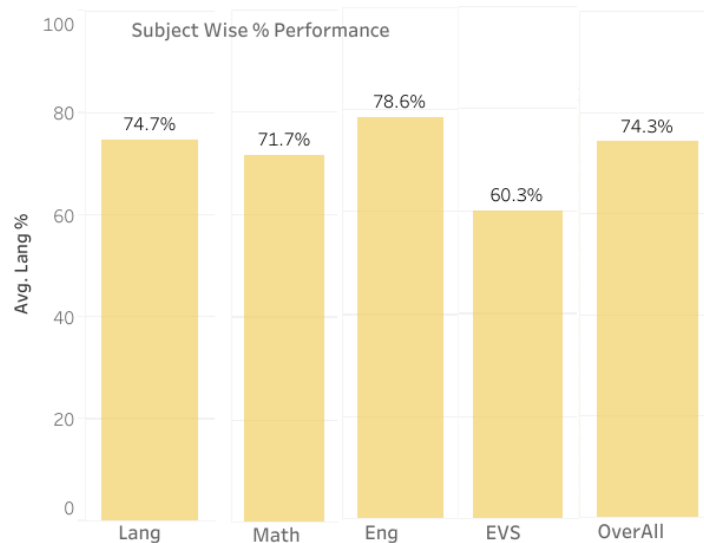
QTA Average %

Mr. Lalit Mohan Pandey from MG Motor visited the Mother's Literacy Programme Training of Trainers in Dehradun and interacted with all the participants.





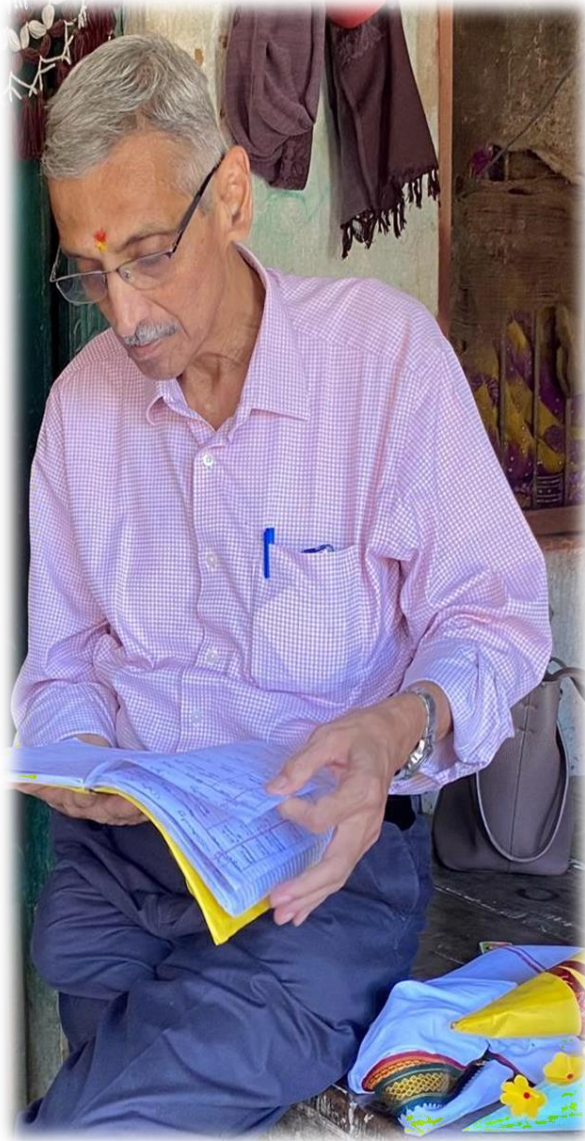
### Visit of IIMPACT Board member
